Career Bio

Dr. Andorful began her career as a ninth-grade social studies teacher in Washington, DC, through Teach For America. She later held leadership positions at nonprofit organizations including Raise DC and CityBridge Education, focusing on partnerships, enrollment, and community engagement. Prior to NSBE, she served as Vice President of Partnerships & Enrollment at Relay Graduate School of Education.

She earned a B.A. in Sociology from Spelman College, an M.A.T. in Secondary Education from American University, a Ph.D. in Cultural & Education Policy Studies from Loyola University Chicago, and a Nonprofit Management Executive Certificate from Georgetown University.

In the November 2024 general election, Andorful was elected to the Prince George's County Board of Education, representing District 1. She officially assumed office on December 2, 2024.
